EARLY CAREER FRAMEWORK

All schools with Early Career Teachers (ECTs) who started in September 2022 should now be registered for their Statutory Induction however if this is something you are yet to do, <u>this document</u> outlines the **three steps** you need to take to ensure your new ECTs are registered. Schools who are yet to register September ECTs for their Induction or ECF Programme are now classed as 'late starters' and should contact the ECF Team to ensure their ECTs are registered accurately on the correct programme: <u>ecf@starinstitute.org.uk</u>.

Registration for January ECTs is now open

There are three places to register ECTs for their induction:

- > The <u>DfE online service</u>
- > With an ECF programme provider
 - o Star deliver the Teach First ECF Programme
- > With an Appropriate Body service

<u>This document</u> outlines the three steps you need to take to ensure your new ECTs are registered for their Induction.



APPROPRIATE BODY

In May 2022 the DfE announced the decision to move to a system in which Teaching School Hubs (TSHs) will become the main providers of AB services and Local Authorities will no longer carry out this role. The DfE have confirmed that Local Authorities will be able to see the ECTs that registered with them from September 2022 through to September 2024 but will not be able to register new ECTs from September 2023.

An ECT cannot start their Induction until they are registered with an Appropriate Body. Registering for an ECF Programme does not mean you are registered with an Appropriate Body service, schools must ensure ECTs are registered for both an ECF Programme and an Appropriate Body.

It is the Appropriate Body that makes the final decision as to whether an ECT has met the Teachers' Standards on the recommendation of the Headteacher/Principal in the school where they work.

DEADLINE

Appropriate Bodies must inform the DfE which ECTs started their Induction in January 2023 before **Wednesday 22 February 23.** Any ECT not registered with an AB before that date may be unable to count their first term towards their Induction.

The DfE has confirmed that funding for all NPQs is available this year. In addition, from autumn 2022, state-funded schools with fewer than 600 pupils will be paid £200 for each teacher or leader they employ who undertakes an NPQ. More information can be found <u>here</u>.

Designing Effective Professional Development

Advanced Mathematics Support Programme

The Advanced Mathematics Support Programme is a government-funded initiative. It aims to increase participation in Core Maths, AS/A level Mathematics and Further Mathematics, and improve the teaching of these level 3 maths qualifications. The programme provides national support for teachers and students in state-funded schools and colleges in England. Additional support is offered in areas of low social mobility so that, whatever their gender, background or location, students can choose their best post-16 maths pathway and have access to high quality teaching. Greater Manchester Computing Hub
