Register your ECTs

Early Career Teachers (ECT) who started their induction in January 2024 must be registered with an **Appropriate Body by Wednesday 21 February 2024** in order for the current term to count towards their induction.

New to Star AB? Complete our <u>Expression of Interest Form</u> to register. **Already registered with Star AB?** Register any new ECTs on <u>ECT Manager</u>.

Please also remember to register ECTs on the DfE's <u>Manage training for early career teachers</u> service and with a provider for the Early Career Framework (ECF) programme:

- To register any new ECTs or ECTs who have already completed one term of their induction, the local Lead Provider is the National Institute of Teaching (NIoT). Register with the NIoT here.
- To register any ECTs who have completed two or more terms of induction, click here to register on the Teach First programme with Star.
